<i>General overview and focus</i>	The 2017 MIME doctoral school aims to provide doctoral students and postdocs added value beyond regular PhD programmes by allowing them to set their research projects in multilingualism against a wider backdrop of language policy design, analysis and evaluation . The school will challenge them to question trends in multilingual research practices and to consider novel approaches in order to better fine-tune and sharpen their research perspective. The central ideas of the MIME 2017 Doctoral School are promoting the interdisciplinary ethos of the MIME project, expanding and deepening student understanding of the multifaceted issue of multilingualism and language policy, and enhancing the interaction between senior and junior researchers. In addition to the central scientific focus, the school will cover topics such





as research funding and project management.

The ultimate goals of the doctoral school are to inspire quality research, ensure reliable and relevant research findings resulting from the project, and achieve a wide dissemination of MIME results both within and beyond the MIME project itself.

The school can accommodate 10 doctoral students and postdocs who will present their research projects, plus additional 10 students who will attend and take active part in the discussions.

ORGANIZATION

Each day is dedicated to two key plenary lectures by one of the instructors, referring in particular to the concepts and methods described in the abstracts and assigned readings.

Following this introduction, in the afternoon of days 2 and 3 the doctoral students present their research projects and receive feedback from both the instructors and their peers. A 30 minute slot will be devoted to each doctoral student who will present their work.

Each day is concluded with an overview and a wrap-up discussion moderated by the instructor.

LANGUAGES

The language of instruction is English, but multilingual interaction is encouraged.





INVOLVEMENT OF DOCTORAL STUDENTS

Doctoral students and postdocs are expected to participate in the following ways:

1. by reading the papers preselected by the instructors, which can be downloaded from the MIME website;
2. by consulting selected additional bibliographical references listed in *MIME 2017 Doctoral School - Abstracts, References, Biographies* document;
3. by engaging in Q&A sessions following the instructors' plenaries
4. by presenting their own research projects (20 min), highlighting in what way their work may contribute to the refinement, development, or possibly reconsideration of some aspects of the theoretical and methodological perspectives presented by the instructors;
5. by responding to the queries, questions and suggestions from the instructors (approximately 10 minutes);
